
Traffic Advisory 2024

The presence of a large number of vehicles entering and exiting GMS(S) compromises on the safety of students and increases the risks of accidents. To provide a safe environment for our students and to minimise the risk of accidents, we seek your understanding in complying with the following options for student drop off and pick up points, and car access into the school.

OPTION 1:

Drop off along Aljunied Road (Gate H) (Monday to Friday between 6.30 am to 7.30 am). Please be vigilant of pedestrians that will be walking along the pavement to/from Aljunied MRT.





OPTION 2:

Drop off from Geylang East Central (Gate A)

On normal days, we seek your cooperation in adhering to the following with for student drop-off and pick-up along Geylang East Central:

- For quick drop-off and pick-up, <u>please use the lay by area at the school's entrance</u> along Geylang East Central. Please note that there will be no waiting at the lay-by area (refer \bigstar on the map).
- Please queue patiently along Geylang East Central when dropping off your child in the morning and avoid over-taking /cutting into vehicles that are ahead as this increases the risk of accidents.
- If you need to wait for your child/ward, please use the URA car parks at either Block 106 or 107 Aljunied Crescent, opposite the School.
- Car access into the school compound be limited to rainy days only.

Do note that if you are driving from Aljunied Road, the traffic light junction outside Geylang Methodist School (Primary)'s entrance is not a U-Turn junction. You can make a U-Turn at the traffic junction about 500 m from the Primary School (please refer to map marked **U**).

With effect from 1st April 2019, motorists may be liable to a fine of between \$100 to \$150 for making unauthorized U-turn, and a fine of between \$400 to \$500 for running the red light at the school zone. More details are available in the Traffic Police Advisory attached.




TRAFFIC POLICE ADVISORY ON ROAD SAFETY

Traffic Police has received feedback on vehicles making unauthorized U-turns at the junction of Geylang East Central by Aljunied Crescent (outside the main gate of Geylang Methodist School (Primary)). There were also feedback on vehicles beating red light at the same location along Geylang East Central by Aljunied Central from both directions. We are deeply concerned about the safety of road users at the area, especially school children who frequent these roads.

- We would like to appeal to all motorists to drive and ride safely, and to abide by all traffic rules and regulations. Motorists are only permitted to make U-turn at authorized junctions and openings.
- We would like to remind motorists dropping off school children at the side gate of Block 120 to exercise care and caution when driving in and out of the carpark for the safety of other road users.

- Making an unauthorized U-turn may be deemed as inconsiderate driving. With effect from 1 April 2019, motorists may be liable to a fine of between \$100 to \$150 for making an unauthorised Uturn and a fine of between \$400 to \$500 for beating red light at the school zone. Additionally, for red light offence, there will be a 13 demerit point penalty for offence committed at the school zone.
- 6 Police will take action against errant road users who flout traffic rules and regulations.
