Dear Parents, Guardians and our newly posted Secondary 1 Students,

A warm welcome to Geylang Methodist School (Secondary).

Under Full Subject-Based Banding or FSBB, Secondary 1 students will be in mixed form classes where they can interact with peers of various strengths and interests. With FSBB, we are moving towards a secondary school education where students learn each subject at the level that best caters to their overall strengths, interests and learning needs. Art, Design and Technology, Food and Consumer Education, PE, Citizenship and Character Education and Music will be offered as Common Curriculum subjects at lower secondary. More information will be provided at the Secondary 1 dialogue session on 7 January 2024 (Tuesday).

To help you settle into the new school environment, you may find it useful to note the following:

1. **School Attire**

School uniform and PE attire must be purchased from our school supplier, Bibi & Baba, only.

3. Offering Subjects at a More Demanding Level

Eligible Secondary 1 students can offer English/ Mathematics/ Science/ Mother Tongue Language at a more demanding level based on their PSLE Achievement Level (AL) for each of these subjects. Students can choose to accept or reject the offer.

Parents whose child is eligible to take subject(s) at a more demanding level will receive the Offer Letter(s) via PG. Please note that you may receive up to 4 separate Offer Letters, depending on the number of subjects your child is eligible for. You will need to submit the Offer Letter(s) by **24 December 2024 (Tuesday)**.

4. Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL)

Please note that students who took Higher Mother Tongue Language (HMTL) in Primary Six are not automatically eligible for HMT in secondary school.

Eligibility criteria to offer HMTL:

Students with a PSLE Score of 8 or better and offer Mother Tongue Language (MTL) at PSLE, **or** students with a PSLE Score of 9-14 and obtained AL1/AL2 in MTL or D/M in HMTL.

The student would have received an MOE offer letter stating that the student qualifies for HMTL in secondary school. Students can choose to accept or reject the offer.

Eligible students will receive HMTL Offer Letters stating that they qualify for HMTL via PG. Parents/guardians are reminded to give consent via PG by **24 December 2024 (Tuesday)**.

OR

Based on the student's Secondary One results, the school and language centre will select and recommend nominated students to study HMTL in secondary school.

- Higher Chinese Language: Student's Semester 1 and Semester 2 Chinese Language results
- Higher Malay and Tamil Language: According to the requirements of the Language Centres

5. 3rd Language (L3)

The L3s which students are eligible for are indicated on their S1 Option Form. If a particular L3 is not indicated, it means they are not eligible for that L3. Students are to indicate the choices of L3 via (i) the S1 Internet System or (ii) through his/her primary school.

Eligibility criteria to offer L3:

	Bahasa Indonesia	For Bahasa Indonesia, students must not have offered ML/HML as their MTL at PSLE. SC/PR or children of SC/PR.
3	French	Students must obtain a PSLE Score of 8 or better. If number of applicants more than vacancies, applicants are selected based on PSLE results. SC/PR or children of SC/PR Offered CL/ML/TL/NTIL at PSLE.

Students who have been assigned M(SP) / C(SP) zonal centres must register online at the respective zonal centres websites to accept the offer. Students who have been offered a Foreign Language must register with MOELC to accept the offer.

Students, who are successful in their application, will receive PG notification from school that they qualify for specific 3rd Language and registration matters. Parents/guardians are reminded to give consent via PG by **6 January 2024 (Monday)**.

6. School Hours

Reporting Time: 7.15 am

Dismissal Time: According to class timetable

The first day of school for 2025 is 2 January (Thursday). Students will be dismissed at 1.15 pm on that day.

Secondary 1 students are to report in GMS(S) school uniform. They are to report in primary school uniform if they are not able to purchase the GMS(S) school uniform by the first day of school. Shoes should be white-based with white shoe laces.

There is a silent reading programme every day from 7.15 am to 7.30 am at the assembly ground / classroom. Students should bring an English storybook to school for this. Students will be considered late if they are not at the assembly ground / classroom by 7.25 am.

7. Secondary 1 Programme and 2-Day Non-Residential Orientation Camp

The Secondary 1 Orientation Programme will be held from **2 to 7 January 2025 (Thursday to Tuesday)**. Students are **not required** to bring curriculum books during the orientation period. They will only need to bring an English storybook for silent reading in the morning.

Your child's/ward's individualised timetable will be distributed by the end of the first week of school. Your child will only need to bring his/her curriculum books and learning materials for lessons from 8 January onwards.

The theme of the Orientation camp is "Laying Strong Foundations" with an emphasis on building good relationships with their classmates and developing their interpersonal and leadership skills.

For Singaporean students with authorised Edusave Enrichment Programme Standing Order (EPSO), the co-payment amount will be deducted from your child/ward's Edusave account. For non-Singaporean students and students without Edusave EPSO, if you have established GIRO Standing Order for payment of Enrichment Programme, kindly maintain the sufficient fund in your bank account for GIRO deduction. Otherwise, kindly make payment via SAM station/SAM Mobile App.
