### (C) LEVEL ACTIVITIES

## 1. Sec 1 ACE Programme (for selected students)

This programme which started in February has helped our students start the year right with the learning and practice of study skills and SEL competencies. Students connected with significant adults who journeyed with them throughout the year as they learn and grow. In Term 4, there will only be 1 session on 14 Sep (Wed). 2. SHINE Programme for Sec 1

As part of the post-exam programme, all Secondary 1 students will take part in the SHINE Programme workshops which aim to broaden students' learning experiences and meet their varied learning needs through applied learning. This programme is an extension of our Student-Initiated Learning programme. Students collaborate and learn together based on their interest and passion.

These workshops are subsidised by the school and the amount payable by each student is \$15. Students who are citizens can tap on the Edusave fund while students who are Permanent Residents or hold Foreign Student's Pass will pay the amount in cash at the General Office if they have not signed up for GIRO services. Further information on the workshops, schedule and payment method will be shared at a later date.

Students will need to pay \$15 for the programme if they are absent without valid reason or MC.

## 3. Subject Combination Matters for Sec 2

After the End-Of-Year Examinations, Sec 2 students will select their 2023 Sec 3 subject combinations. Another briefing will be conducted with the students nearer the date.

#### 4. Sec 2 NT ACE Programme

This programme started in February to help students develop the ability to reflect and lead through healthy living, outdoor appreciation and service learning. As the programme had ended in Term 3, students will be dismissed after their last lesson on Tuesdays at 1.45 pm.

## 5. Sec 2 N(T) Experience ITE Programme @ ITE College East

Students will report to school in full school uniform for the usual morning assembly and a 2-way transport will be provided.

## 6. Multimedia, Music, Art, Dance and Drama (MADD) Fiesta for Sec 2

The MADD Fiesta is part of the school's Aesthetics development programme, conducted as part of the post-examination programme, to give students an opportunity to discover an aspect of the Arts that interests them. Workshops will include Micro:bits, Digital DJ-ing, Mural Painting, Hip Hop Dance and Guitar. These workshops are subsidized by the school and National Arts Council. The balance payable by each student is \$35. Students who are citizens can tap on the Edusave fund while students who are Permanent Residents or hold Foreign Student's Pass will pay the amount in cash at the General Office if they have not signed up for GIRO services. Further information on the workshops, schedule and payment method will be made available at a later date.

## 7. Sec 2 NE Cum Art Appreciation Programme - The LKY Musical for selected students

## (D) ACADEMIC UPDATES

## 1. Humanities Sec 3 Online Geographical Investigation (GI)

As part of geographical inquiry, all Sec 3E Geography Elective and Core Geography students will investigate the following issues: Singapore tourism, how tourism has shaped Singapore's economic development and real-world tourism. Through this online group investigation project, students will acquire data collection and representation skills.

## 2. Post-Exam Remediation/Consultation for Sec 1-3

These lessons will be conducted for identified students to bridge their learning gaps and enhance their understanding before they return in 2023. The remediation lessons will be conducted for 8 days from 31 Oct (Mon) to 9 Nov (Wed).

#### 1. National Examination Matters

Students sitting for the national examinations are reminded to bring their Entry Proof, NRIC or foreign identification documents and thermometers when they report to school.

## 1.1 GCE N-Level Written Examinations

This will commence on 13 Sep (Mon), over two periods:

Part 1:

Part 2:

3 Oct (Mon) - 13 Oct (Thu)

4N students will not need to report back to school after Part 2 of the N-Level Examinations. They will be informed by their Form Teachers when the release date of results is confirmed.

#### 2. Assessment for Sec 1-3

#### 2.1 End-Of-Year Examination

The End-Of-Year Examination for Sec 1 to 3 will be held from 28 Sep (Wed) –13 Oct (Thu). The exam time-table was distributed to your child/ward in Term 3 Week 10. Students need not report to school on 14 Oct (Fri), Marking Day and 25 Oct (Tue), Moderation and Promotion Day.

### 2.2 English Language Oral Examinations

Oral Exam Dates:

Sec 2E/N(A): 21 Sep (Wed) from 2.15pm to 6.00pm.

Sec 3E/N(A): 14 Sep (wed) from 2.15pm to 6.00pm.

Sec 2N(T)/3N(T): The oral examinations will be conducted during the end-of-year examinations. Students can refer to the examination timetable for details.

#### Other information:

For Sec2E/N(A) only: The video stimuli will be available on the SLS from 14 September.

For 2N(T) only. The video stimuli will be available on the SLS from 3 October.

Students will be briefed by their EL teachers on how the oral examinations will be conducted and how to prepare for them.

### 2.3 Mother Tongue (MT)

Lower Sec MT Oral Examinations will be conducted during the end-of-year examinations and the schedule is indicated in the examination time-table. Oral passages had been given to the students to prepare and practise at home. In addition, teachers have also prepared the students during lesson time.

Term 4 MT GEMS Challenge will comprise local learning experiences where students will experience a virtual tour of a Chinese city and interact with Singaporean undergraduates studying in universities in China. More details will be provided to the students and parents by the teacher in-charge in due course.
