2024 TERM 3 LETTER

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In the first semester, we celebrated the 100th anniversary of our school or GM100 with our students through exciting programmes such as the GM Family Carnival and the Centennial Thanksgiving Service. We also involved all classes to contribute to the painting of our GM100 Wall Mural. Through these programmes, we wanted to instill in our students a deep sense of pride and a strong sense of belonging to GM. At the end of Term 2, each student was presented with "Seeds of Light", a graphic novel as a gift for GM100. We hope that students will learn about the history of our school and feel proud of our school through this fun approach of reading "Seeds of Light".

At this year's Committee of Supply debate, the Ministry of Education (MOE) shared that it will strengthen our emphasis on 21st Century Competencies (21CC) to help our students cultivate future-ready competencies that will better enable them to achieve their aspirations and contribute back to society.

In line with this, MOE will enhance the Edusave Award for Achievement, Good Leadership and Service (EAGLES) to include a new 21CC domain, to recognise students' exemplary demonstration of competencies such as (i) Critical, Adaptive and Inventive Thinking, (ii) Civic, Global and Cross-Cultural Literacy, as well as (iii) Communication, Collaboration and Information Skills, in both curricular and co-curricular settings.

In GMS(S), the E21CC skill that we are focusing on for this award is Communication Skills. Communication Skills is one of the skills that we develop in our students through our Learning for Life Programme (LLP) in the area of Community and Youth Leadership. This is an important part of realizing our vision to develop students to be "Passionate Learners, Courageous Leaders, Caring Citizens". The teaching of skills in our LLP are guided by Kouzes and Posner's Model in Transformational Leadership which provides a breadth of practices to develop student leaders - challenging the process, inspiring a shared vision, enabling others to act, modeling the way, and encouraging the heart (Kouzes & Posner, 1995, 2002). Later in the term, we will be communicating to students, staff and parents on how they can nominate students for this award.

We wish all our students and their families a very blessed and fruitful Term 3!

(B) STUDENT WELFARE, WELL-BEING AND SAFETY

Temperature-Taking Exercise on 3 Jul, Wed

There will be a temperature-taking exercise for the whole school after assembly on 3 Jul, Wed. Students are expected to have a working oral digital thermometer with them for this exercise.

Emergency Drill - Evacuation to External Holding Area on 16 Jul, Tue

This will be conducted on 16 Jul, Tue at 7.45 am to better prepare our students and staff to respond quickly in the event that we need to evacuate from the school premises. Students will move to an external holding area (Geylang Chinese Methodist Church) which is within walking distance from the school. The exercise is expected to take not more than 2 hours. After the evacuation exercise, students will return to school to continue lessons for the day.

(C) STUDENT MANAGEMENT

Vaping at any age, and underaged smoking are illegal. All e-cigarettes, cigarettes and other types of vaporisers are harmful and can adversely affect health and families. Youths who are caught using or possessing such products will be reported to the Health Sciences Authority and disciplinary actions will be taken.

(D) STUDENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

1 CCA matters/Unstructured Play

CCAs will resume from Term 3 Week 1 for all Sec 1 to 3 students. Attendance in CCA is compulsory. Failure to achieve 75% attendance per year will result in a poor LEAPS 2.0 attainment. Students will not be allowed to change their CCA in Semester 2.

To encourage unstructured play during recesses, students are encouraged to bring their own equipment, practise safe play and be responsible for one another's well-being. Students are also to observe punctuality for lessons and return all equipment after play.

2 After-school engagement (ASE) programme

A variety of activities are offered after school to engage our students. Do encourage your child to participate.

For parents who had registered their child for the show earlier will receive their ticket in term 3. Students are required to bring along the ticket and student card for admission.

4 Values In Action (VIA)

Sec 1 will be involved in a VIA programme that focuses on the environment and sustainability. They will learn about how they can protect the environment and make informed choices and contribute towards a more sustainable Singapore. (E) Updates on National Digital Literacy Programme

To prepare your child better in learning with the Personalised Learning Device (PLD), all Sec 1 students will be assigned a series of self-paced digital literacy modules via SLS in Semester 2 during HBL days. They had also been enrolled in the National Digital Explorer 2024 programme and would have completed the first module on Word Processing by the start of Term 3. They have until 18 Oct Fri to complete the second module on Spreadsheet computing.

Parents are requested to work with the school to remind their child on the following:

- Lockers had been installed outside every class and students can keep their PLDs in the lockers securely when the PLDs are not in use
- PLDs should be brought home at the end of every school day so that they can be fully charged for lessons the following day
- Students who have issues with their ICT accounts or PLDs can refer to page 20 and 21 of the Student Handbook for support.

(F) SCHOOL EVENTS

1 Racial Harmony Day Celebrations (RHD)

To commemorate RHD, activities are planned to help students reflect on our shared experiences and values in a multi-racial and multi-religious society like Singapore. The celebrations will take place during the Racial Harmony Week from 15-19 Jul.

2 NRIC Registration for 15-year-old students (25 Jun)

This will be conducted in school on 25 Jun for Singapore Citizens and Permanent Residents. All 15-year-old students involved in this registration should receive a notification from ICA. As shared in an earlier letter to you, parents are reminded to complete the online registration (<u>go.gov.sg/icreg</u>) at least 3 days before the registration appointment in school on 25 Jun.

You are required to:

- Indicate your child's particulars
- Upload your child's photograph and supporting documents (where applicable)
- Make payment for the application (\$10 for citizens / \$50 for permanent residents)

3 National Day Celebrations (8 Aug)

This will be celebrated 8 Aug with an observance ceremony and meaningful activities. The theme of this year "*Together, As One United People*" highlights the collective strength of our people and underscores the importance of every citizen rallying to share our future and uplift those around us. The theme also encapsulates the essence of our Nation's success and resilience. While the road ahead may be uncertain, our strength lies within our diversity. It reflects the spirit of inclusivity, community and trust that has enabled us to overcome and flourish in the last 59 years.

4 Teachers' Day Celebrations (29 Aug)

We will celebrate Teachers' Day on 29 Aug. Led by the Student Council, the celebrations will include performances and games put up by students, CCA groups and also showcases GM's Talent-time 'GEMS Got Talent'. The theme for this year is *Guiding Lights*. The Teachers' Day rehearsal will be held on 22 Aug and student leaders involved would be notified at a later date.

3D-2N Outdoor Adventure Learning Camp for Sec 1 (Term 4 Week 1)

As part of the National Outdoor Adventure Education Masterplan, all students will get to participate in three cohort camps during their school years. Our Sec 1 students will be participating in a 3-day, 2-night residential Outdoor Adventure Learning Camp which aims to develop well-rounded individuals through enriching and authentic experiences outside the classroom. It will help students build resilience, ruggedness, responsibility and essential 21st century competencies for sustainable active and healthy living. As a key Student Development Experience, this camp allows students to apply the skills and knowledge gained in Outdoor Education and CCE lessons, significantly contributing to their holistic development. These experiences foster confidence, teamwork and an appreciation for diversity.

The EL oral exam would be held on 2 Jul, Tue from 2.15 pm to 6 pm, for students taking 3N(A)/3N(T) OSS and 3N(T) EL.

On the day of the examination, they are to bring their Entry Proof and ID with photo identification and to report punctually as well as to adhere to all rules and regulations.
